Elementary Students Cook Thanksgiving Feast in Classrooms

Cascade, CO - A family-style feast prepared in the classrooms by elementary students - that's how staff and students at Ute Pass Elementary School celebrated Thanksgiving this year.

It was also an opportunity for students to make connections between food and literature while also practicing math skills and learning all about recipes and food preparation. Each grade level prepared a different side dish for lunch.

"For me, education is about connections and food is a really awesome way to connect to the world. It's a great way to connect to culture," said Ute Pass Elementary School teacher Terrence Batson. "You see a lot of math connections made when making food in terms of recipes and quantities that have to be worked out."

All staff and students got to sit side-by-side to eat a family-style meal.

"It means so much as a principal. This is the exact kind of culture and feel that you want, that our students and staff are at a place where they feel like they belong to something, that they have a community just within the walls of our building and that each student knows that their voice is valued and they are important here at Ute Pass," said Ute Pass Elementary School principal Jackie Powell.

Principal Powell hopes this will be the start of a new tradition at Ute Pass Elementary.
